Services are provided in a home-like setting. This is a fee-for-service program. **Passport Services:** Community participation activities, out of home Respite, personal or employment supports may be purchased and provides a worry-free experience and peace of mind.

 - Practice from an intersectional lens to address the challenges diverse individuals face and explore strategies to advance equality and equity;
 - Lean into practices that promote anti-oppressive, anti-colonialism, and anti-racism, Humana Community Services recognizes barriers, risks, and analysis of power therefore seeks to enhance how power can be shared with individuals at all points of service delivery.
- A treatment trajectory is based on evidence-informed assessments, interventions, and evaluations through a holistic approach.
